

Todd Langenmayr is a native of Suffern, NY and currently lives in Mahwah, NJ with his wife, Kristen, and their three children. Todd swam for Suffern High School and went on to earn a scholarship to swim for Florida Atlantic University. Todd started the New York Sharks in September 2003 with 38 athletes. Todd has spent many weeks over the past six summers at the University of Texas where he has worked with and been mentored by Olympic Head Coach, Eddie Reese, one of the world's greatest coaches. Todd has had the opportunity to work with multiple Olympic swimmers from University of Texas, many of whom have visited New York Sharks for camps and clinics over the past four years. Todd has watched Eddie lead multiple Gold Medalists into big meets including the Olympic Games in 2004 and 2008.
